### Footnotes

GOOD PROSPECT sat forwardly placed while taking the inside route, was intermittently coaxed along to maintain interest, continued to bide time during the run around the far turn, was forced to await suitable options from the quarter pole to upper stretch, gained clear passage along the rail once the pacesetter had drifted into the two path, launched a bold run, grabbed a short lead and finished gamely to preserve it. DESERT WHEAT underwent a three wide journey and finished with good courage to garner the place. MY MAN MARTY stalked the pacesetter from the outside, ranged up to increase the pressure upon reaching the second turn, was asked for run just prior to the quarter pole, struck the front in midstretch, but with serious challengers lurking both to the inside and to the outside, couldn't preserve a narrow advantage but held well enough to the end for the show. CAUSE I CAN rode the rail early, was taken outward nearing the end of the backstretch, swung four wide into upper stretch and displayed a mild stretch response. EAST INDIES was hustled away from the gate to secure the top, got switched over to rating tactics after achieving the goal, set the pace from the inside, needed encouragement by the five-sixteenths pole to maintain the lead, came under heavy pressure during the run through the furlong grounds, succumbed to it and weakened in the final furlong. THE CUFF SHOOTER took the inside route for nearly three-quarters pole, came four wide into the stretch and was empty. MOUNT KARAKORUM raced along the outside and was through after going six furlongs.
