**Footnotes**

CASTLES BURNING broke well and had some say in the pace right from the get-go, vied for command down the backstretch, briefly doing so from between rivals until MISS SILVER BIRCH was squeezed out of the pocket nearing the end of backstretch, entered the turn one on one with LUCK IN THE CITY, tucked into the two path as the previously mentioned rival was settling along the rail, added slightly to what started out as a slim advantage, by the quarter pole, rider sitting chilly as the pressure attempted to intensify, got let out after reaching upper stretch, kicked away to a comfortable margin, kept to a drive. FALL INTO FAITH unhurried for well over a half, advanced four wide from the three-eighths pole into a contending position as the field headed into the lane, proved no match for the winner, then just held the place. MISS SILVER BIRCH ranged up willingly down along the rail in the initial stages eventually drawing alongside a pair, poked a long nose in front to hold the lead for at least a couple of jumps, had pressure coming from IMGINE TOMORROW a short distance from the half mile pole, was put to a snug hold getting squeezed back in the pocket, then steadied just off that foe's heels near the top of the turn, lost ground and momentum as a result, got back going to be back within range coming to the quarter pole, was forced to remain on hold stuck behind the top one, entered the stretch and found enough room to tip outward, showed some belatedly energy but fell short of securing second. LUCK IN THE CITY disputed the pace from outside the winner to the furlong grounds before backing away. LADY JARLYN stalked the front runners from off the rail and tired after going six furlongs. HONEY DUE TELL off a beat slowly, saved ground until the quarter pole, commenced the stretch drive three wide, had little to offer. IMAGINE TOMORROW contested the pace with another pair momentarily in the initial stages, was allowed to drop back a bit, gradually worked her way onto the inside route near the half mile pole, didn't take it for too long, getting swung outward into the three path a furlong later, tired after turning for home.
