EMPIRE MAKER came away quickly and raced close up while three wide, advanced three wide on the far turn, moved to the front under confident handling approaching the eighth pole and was kept alert with a couple of under hand slaps from the right side while drifting in slightly nearing the finish. FUNNY CIDE was bumped after the start, raced with the pace while in hand, advanced with the winner approaching the stretch and dug in gamely on the rail in the drive. KISSIN SAINT was bumped after the break, was taken to the inside, raced on the rail, put in a run along the inside on the second turn and had little left for the drive. NEW YORK HERO came out after the start, was hustled to the front, set the pace along the inside and gave way in upper stretch. SENOR SWINGER was bumped after the start, dropped back early, raced three wide on the second turn and had no response when roused. INDY DANCER was outrun early, came wide into the stretch and had no rally. SKY SOLDIER was bumped after the start, was steadied entering the first turn, chased the pace along the inside and tired after three quarters. SPITE THE DEVIL raced inside and tired.
