## **Footnotes**

PRECIOUS METAL unhurried while primarily two wide for the initial three-quarters, was heavily roused taking the three path for entrance into the stretch, forged his way to the front in deep stretch and kicked away. MADRIS exchanged a series of hard bumps with EXPORTER right after start, settled into the two path before reaching the first turn, tipped out an additional path by the end of the backstretch, scurried into contention during the ensuing furlong, had dead aim coming to the end of the furlong grounds, yet failed to claim the advantage, couldn't keep pace with the winner but held on well to grab the place. LE DELUGE chased from the two path, altered course outward a couple of lanes nearing the eighth pole, lacked a solid late closing punch. RINCON SUR (ARG) grabbed the early advantage, made it over to the rail by the end of the homestretch, got rated showing the way, came under heavy pressure as three-quarters was being completed and was soon called upon, offered good resistance before yielding well past the eighth pole. WAYWARD SAILOR bumped from both sides shortly after the start, took the inside route on the far turn, got set down swinging three wide into the stretch, mustered up a mild kick going by mostly weak and tired ones. MONEY IN MOTION underwent a ground-saving journey and was outfinished. EXPORTER shook off a series of sound bumps early while racing down the chute, prompted the pace from the two path to upper stretch before backing away. JUNIOR OFFICER bumped and pinched back shortly after the start, trailed throughout.
