Footnotes

TREBLEMAKER quickly established control, was under a firm hold for nearly a half showing the way from the two path, was cued up with some light hand urging during the last few strides around the bend, with all the closest pursuers having been put to a drive, before getting set down himself at the head of the stretch, emerged from the furlong grounds in possession of his biggest advantage, was kept to a drive prior to being geared down the final seventy yards. BEAT OF THE DRUM chased the winner from the outside, was under a drive by the five-sixteenths pole, proved no match, but held the place. QUIET MIRACLE off the inside, rallied for the show. CEPHEUS three wide, was under a drive coming into the stretch, lacked the needed response. SUNRISE LOVER under a drive turning for home four wide, made no impact. UPROARIOUS GEORGE quickly tucked on the rail, was no factor. HOBOKEN JOE got away last after making some contact with the left side of the starting gate, getting turned slightly sideways in the opposite direction as a result, was used hard by the rider to reach midpack, settled along the inside coming to the end of the backstretch, remained under a strong drive on the turn and gave way.
