Footnotes

GIANT INDIAN tracked the pace inside, came under urging to keep pace from the seven-sixteenths, shifted around the tiring pace setter at the quarter pole fully engaged by the rider, availed of the opportunity to angle to the rail in the vicinity of the three-sixteenths, rallied along the rail digging in to wear down the leader in the final strides and prevail. TRIPENCICULAR prompted the pacemaker from the three path, took command from that tiring foe at the head of the lane and was put to a drive, inched away momentarily with a furlong to go, was caught in the final strides to the wire while all out and safe for place honors. WICKED IRISH reserved off the pace, came under urging from the five-sixteenths, swung four wide in upper stretch displaying a good kick through the lane for show honors. TRICKEY GUY placed three to four wide in close pursuit of the front, was set down at the top of the lane, loomed just in behind with a furlong to go, ran on in contention until the final sixteenth, weakening in the late stages while settling for the last major share. WILLY PAY outrun in the early stages, was placed in the two path saving ground through the turn until nearing the top of the stretch, angled out five wide at that station, was placed to a drive, rallied belatedly with a good kick by mostly tired rivals. SCRAP DRAGON took the overland route through the turn, was under encouragement at the five-sixteenths to pick it up but made no late headway through the lane. CANWEWIN allowed to settle early on, saved ground throughout the turn, angled out for a clear lane at the eighth pole to the four path and offered little. FOUR MILLION stumbled slightly after the start, was in tight between rivals at the three-eighths and eased back, came under a drive at the top of the lane and offered no response. IT'S TRULY AHVEE broke well, set a prompted pace from the two path, angled in to the rail while tiring and displaced at the quarter pole and gave way.
