VERY CHERRY CANDY sat reserved from off the inside for nearly a half, tipped into the three path near the five-sixteenths pole, joined up with the front runners as the threesome spun into the stretch, vied with vigor for command outside a pair during the run through the furlong grounds, continued the battle one on one with the runner up thereafter, proved game, getting up at the wire to prevail. MAMA ZEE away with no apparent mishap, contended the lead while hugging the rail, pilot alternating between utilizing light hand urging and a firmer grip on the reins, bumped with YOUR MOVE while momentarily in tight past the half mile pole, fell back slightly with the loss of momentum, picked up interest when asked to and re-bid cutting the corner into the stretch, forged her way to a narrow advantage against another twosome parked to her outside, offered good resistance but got denied in the last jump. MY DONNA JEAN chased from the two path on the turn, swung four wide into the stretch, lacked the needed late response. AMULAY underwent a three wide pursuit on the bend, had no rally. YOUR MOVE disputed the pace from the two path, bumped lightly with her fellow combatant in the vicinity of the seven-sixteenths marker, got put to the test by a pair of rivals heading for the quarter pole, one on each side of her, fought between them for the next furlong before backing away.
