### Footnotes

ALI'S WINNER came out of the starting gate with no apparent mishap, sat forwardly while placed well off the inside down the backstretch, departed it three wide, lost position to the runner up after that foe was angled outward at the five-sixteenths marker, was already under solid encouragement taking the four path for entrance into the lane, kicked in with good energy and took charge before reaching the eighth pole, drifted out slightly thereafter but edged away nonetheless. POTUS stalked the front runners racing along the outside, coaxed along to keep pace, was put to stronger handling then angled to be outside the pace combatants late on the turn, turned for home under a drive, with the eventual winner just off his hind quarters, got outfinished by the top one but continued on well to secure second. PROFESSOR CHAOS three wide on the turn, rallied for the show award. THE KENOSHA KID disputed the pace from the outside, took over to lead the field into the stretch, with the top twosome in hot pursuit to his outside, surrendered the lead making his way through the furlong grounds and steadily weakened into the last board spot. DOWNGOESFRAZIER in the two path and asked for a response midway around the bend, failed to answer the call. IMASPEEDYGUY lagged behind, took the inside route until midstretch, leaving it only out of necessity to steer by a tiring opponent. SONNYANDPALLY faded off a ground-saving journey. COMSTOCK PRIZE was gradually guided over towards the inside while proceeding down the backstretch, tucked along the rail at the half mile pole, argued to maintain a slight advantage until the vicinity of the five-sixteenths pole, relinquished and rapidly wilted.
