ARENA ELVIRA away in good order, took up a forward post soon after the start, was put to a firm hold keeping a watchful eye on the pacesetter, continued along on the same scenario for the opening six furlongs, got let out a notch and drew abreast of BANKER'S BUY midway on the far turn, with the runner up lurking a danger directly to the outside of the two front runners, was set down entering the stretch, emerged from the eighth pole with a comfortable advantage and drew out further, crossing the wire under a vigorous hand ride. CHECK POINT three wide around both turns, was put to a prolonged drive and held on well to secure the place. GO UNBRIDLED well reserved for the initial six furlongs, was under encouragement turning for home four wide, rallied mildly to be along for the show. TIZ MIZ SUE put to a firm hold, was eased back and taken off heels early on the opening bend, tracked the well-rated pacesetter while saving ground, found room and slipped out to be two wide midpoint on the second turn, came one path into the stretch and got called upon, failed to fire. BANKER'S BUY well rated from the inside while setting moderate opening splits, came under pressure nearing the three-eighths pole, was asked for some run during the later stages of the run around the far turn, succumbed by upper stretch and steadily tired.
