**Footnotes**

WHICH MARKET sat reserved along the outside for nearly three-quarters, picked up interest late on the far turn and commenced to rally in earnest after settling into upper stretch, was forced to check when caught behind rivals in the vicinity of the three-sixteenths pole, lost momentum for a stride or two before resuming his stretch run, found his best stride departing the eighth pole, accelerated with good energy from along the inside to grab the lead just prior to the wire. SILVER MAX kicked clear of the competition after the start, tucked along the inside and set the initial splits on an open lead, was lightly coaxed during the later stages of the run around the far turn as the pressure from the closest pursuer intensified, was still feeling the heat from that opponent when put to a drive leading the field into the stretch, left the eighth pole comfortably in front, had that margin steadily cut into, got overhauled by the full of run eventual winner but dug in with good determination to preserve the place. SHAUN WASHINGTON three wide around both bends, was under a drive spinning into the lane, came home willingly to earn the show award. COACH ROYAL three wide on the second turn, rallied to grab the last major check. GET RIGHT made contact with GRANDPA LEN just of the starting gate, was taken hold while in a bit tight between rivals leaving the chute, went on to assume the role of stalker, was let out a notch to sit perched just off the pacesetter's hind quarters on the far turn, kept up that pressure until upper stretch before backing away. SATURDAY'S FOR FUN chased from the outside and lacked a kick. GRANDPA LEN bumped after the start, raced as a forward factor from the inside and tired. WAR HITCH saved ground throughout. DUPES reluctant to load, swerved in sharply at the start, was under stout restraint while rank in the opening stages, failed to reach a contending position. TERMINUS raced along the outside and was outrun.
