ISN'T HE PERFECT away in good order, moved up to assume a good forward position, sat reserved off the pace activity under a good hold towards the two path, paused for a stride or two leaving the five-sixteenths pole, awaiting options, found a narrow but usable seam just up ahead after turning for home, squeezed by, with little room to spare, in the vicinity of the three-sixteenths pole, en route to taking charge, then dug in determinedly under good handling to preserve it. KENNEDY unhurried during the opening half, unleashed a four wide run around the turn to reach a good striking position, continued on with good courage during the stretch run to garner place honors. BATTER UP bumped between rivals just after the start, raced three wide on the turn, bid between rivals from there coming to the quarter pole, remained a prominent factor during the ensuing furlong before flattening out a bit. WILLY PAY was bumped after bobbling at the start, advanced to a forward spot during the run down the backstretch, pressed the front runners from the three path during most of the run around the bend, weakened leaving the furlong grounds. SAMURAI SWORD took the inside route, fought against the bit, while resisting the rating tactics being applied by the rider during the initial half, lacked the necessary stretch response after turning for home. SKYWAY TO HEAVEN bumped between rivals at the start, saved ground and improved position with a mild rally. EAST INDIES vied between rivals for the lead, steadied while weakening in the vicinity of the three-sixteenths pole. GIANT FEAT raced along the outside and was outrun. WING GLIDER was knocked sideways after being bumped at the start, went on fight his way to the lead, was guided over to the rail at the seven-sixteenths pole, vied from there with two other opponents, was urged to

keep pace at the five-sixteenths pole before backing off. MEDIEVAL SWORD appeared to clip heels a few jumps out of the starting gate, and failed to reach a contending position.
