REDEEMED assumed the role of stalker soon after the start, kept a watchful eye on the pacesetter from the two path, remained at some distance behind that opponent until nearing the end of the backstretch, picked up the pace upon reaching the far turn, made a successful challenge midway on the turn, got asked for a response heading into the stretch, emerged from the furlong grounds in possession of a comfortable advantage, safely maintained it, being geared down a short distance past the sixteenth pole. SOCIALSAUL worked out a tuck into the two path early on the first turn, bided time stalking the pacesetter from off the inside, paused in hand going past the stricken former pacesetter past the three-eighths pole, turned for home and got called upon, proved no match for the top one en route to garnering place honors. RAISON D'ETAT strung out in the three path around each bend, was already some encouragement from the half mile pole, got out finished. ARTHUR'S TALE three wide around both turns, lacked the necessary stretch response. ELTHEEB took the inside route, angled around the rival in distress, with no apparent mishap in doing so, in the vicinity of the five-sixteenths pole, lacked a solid closing punch once called upon.. GOLDEN GULCH saved ground, swung four wide into upper stretch, had no offering to render. PHILLY ACE stumbled badly at the break, raced from off the inside, made an abbreviated attempt to improve position on the far turn, but soon flattened out. GHOST GUNNER quickly established control, showed the way, well rated from the inside and on an open lead, came under pressure nearing the three-eighths pole, appeared ready to succumb to it when he broke down, was quickly and expertly pulled up by the rider and subsequently vanned off.
