JUNIOR OFFICER well off the inside from the get-go, sat positioned along the overland route off a wall of four rivals spread out across the track for most of the run around the bend, was asked for run prior to spinning into the stretch, was in close proximity alongside TONINTHIRTEEN during the initial portion of the stretch drive, forged on ahead leaving the eighth pole, collaring the runner up in the last jump. STRAIGHT FAX departed the backstretch three wide, pressed the issue from between opponents as a group numbering four scurried around the turn, got set down for the stretch run, fought his way to a narrow advantage in the vicinity of the sixteenth pole, clung desperately to it in the middle of foes only to get nipped right at the wire. LITTLE DALE argued for control, hounded by three rivals in paths two through four on the turn, gained no respite after entering the stretch, remaining fully engaged with the second place finisher, yielded reluctantly with about a sixteenth to go. GOODTIME BOY stacked four wide departing the backstretch, vied as the widest of a quartet on the turn, fell back slightly just before reaching the top of the lane, bumped repeatedly with LOST DECADE holding his established path as that one was trying to bully his way out to optimal clearance. LOST DECADE the earliest leader, albeit by only a sliver, had a string of three foes latch on and got taken back proceeding towards the end of the backstretch, tracked the fighting foursome near the inside until the five-sixteenths marker, angled outward, went on a little further then got set down, left the sixteenth pole idling behind a pair of foes, tried to bull his way into better racing room, bumped several times with GOODTIME BOY after that opponent refused to yield position. TONINTHIRTEEN angled off the rail to be three wide late on the turn, lacked the needed response. WHY BROADWAY disputed the pace from between rivals for nearly a half and gave way.
