KELLI GOT FROSTY advanced from slightly off the rail under light hand urging to grab the early lead shortly entering the backstretch, coasted along, entrenched in the two path, kept to some the light hand urging to maintain interest, shook well clear of the others before turning for home, was almost at the three-sixteenths marker before getting called for run, was under a brisk hand ride from that station until the sixteenth pole, then finished the race well geared down. AGILION in the three path and set down midway on the turn, went by several rivals and was sent over to the rail prior to the quarter pole, cut the corner into the lane under a drive, proved no match for the winner, while clearly second best. BIT BUSTIN chased the winner from off the inside, was roused by the three-eighths pole, tired. JERUSALEM STONE saved ground until the five-sixteenths pole, angled to be five wide by upper stretch, failed to menace. CARAMEWAY in the four path departing the backstretch, gave way. FLATTERMEWITHROSES outside and asked by the three-eighths pole, folded.
