### Footnotes

CHIEF EXPORT reserved while racing along the outside, was fanned three wide turning for home, rallied in earnest after being asked for a response in upper stretch, drew alongside the leader leaving the eighth pole and proved best under good handling. KAMBOOS MAN involved in an early three-way skirmish for the lead, took charge soon after the opening quarter, ducked inward once sufficiently clear to begin the run around the bend, left the furlong grounds still maintaining a clear advantage, dug in when the top one made his presence, failed to stave off that one but held well to secure the place. BUBBA GUM vied for the lead along the inside during the initial quarter, conceded the top approaching the turn, remained well placed thereafter tracking the leader along the inside and finished willingly to grab show honors. FEROCIOUS WON was bumped after bobbling at the start, raced within striking distance for a half, was five wide at the quarter pole, had the rider lose the whip in the vicinity of the three-sixteenths pole, continued on well to the wire. BRUCKER'S BROTHER pressed the pace from the outside for a half before backing off. END OF AN ERA was never involved. MON SENOR was no factor. REALITTOUR squeezed back at the start, was outrun thereafter. STORM BOOT GOLD bumped at the start, displayed only brief foot. BROOKER D offered little.
