CAT IN THE FOREST responded to a snug grip on the reins by the rider early down the backstretch, secured the two path and rated kindly, well placed just behind an ongoing pace dispute, turned for home with an inviting opening for the taking, yet bided time for an additional sixteenth before going on through, drew abreast of the leader a short distance later, wrested away the lead in the vicinity of the sixteenth pole and edged clear. SODA POP KID took the inside route, and launched a rail rally to procure the place. WILDCAT FRANKIE was hustled to grab the early lead, settled along the rail soon afterwards, argued for command from there with two other rivals until the quarter pole, shook them off only to face a new challenger in the form of the eventual winner, clung to a narrow lead until the sixteenth pole, got out kicked late for the place as well, but still held on reasonably well to secure the show. MISSILE MOTOR raced three wide, was asked for run by the five-sixteenths pole, proved no match. NO DETOUR disputed the pace from between rivals on the turn and gave way. I'VE GOT THE FEVER contested the pace as the widest of a threesome until the quarter pole before backing away. SYSTEM RESTORE off the inside, trailed.
