Footnotes

DRAW TWO away slowly, remained unhurried near the back of the pack in the early going, was two wide departing the backstretch, picked up interest prior to angling outward from the five-sixteenths pole, eventually settling into the four path by the head of the stretch, responded positively when given his cue, collared the leader with about a sixteenth to go, wrested away the advantage for good and edged away. STORMY LEN placed under a firm hold by the rider shook well clear of the competition, extended the margin to its biggest between calls down the backstretch, slightly shy of five lengths at its very biggest all told, had the field closing in rapidly upon reaching the full turn and came under heavy pressure just as the third split was being recorded, bided time the rest of the way to the quarter pole before being called upon, spun into the stretch with a wall of three spread outward on the course from the rail in hot pursuit, held his ground well during the ensuing furlong, had the winner drew on even terms in the vicinity of the sixteenth pole, relinquished shortly afterwards, but continued onward in a willing manner to be second best. HAPPY FELLA saved ground for a bit more than three-quarters, slipped into the two path a few strides before swinging into the stretch, angled outward, bothering and bumping with LEAD SINGER in upper stretch, got outfinished in the last eighth. SNAKE PIT mostly three wide until the top of the lane, lacked the needed response. YELLOW MOUNTAIN (IRE) raced at a considerable distance from off the rail along the chute, was taken to the inside departing it, stayed along the rail making his way down the backstretch, tipped back to the outside upon reaching the turn, had no rally. RIGHT RIGHT off to a sluggish start, swung three wide into the stretch with no offering to give. LEAD SINGER unhurried from off the inside, was in the three path and in the vanguard of a group composing of all but couple of member of members closing in rapidly on the former loose leader coming to the five-sixteenths pole, spun into the stretch asked for his best, was attempting to rally when forced to steady after HAPPY FELLA initiated contact near the three-sixteenths marker, failed to regain any real interest. BAKER STREET stalked from along the outside from afar during the initial stages, picked up the pace and partnered up with LEAD SINGER to lead the competition towards STORMY LEN during the run the full turn, challenged from between rivals for the lead at the five-sixteenths pole, continued within range, wedged in the midst of others to upper stretch before backing away.
