All starters including supplemental nominees to receive a \$1,500 rebate. The purse to be divided 60% to the owner of the winner, 20% to second, 10% to third, 5% to fourth, 3% to fifth and 2% divided equally among the remaining finishers. NYRA will waive the entry and starting fees to any of the first three finishers of the Peter Pan to the Belmont Stakes excluding supplemental nominees to the Belmont Stakes. Weight 123 lbs. Non-winners of \$200,000 at a mile or over in 2012 allowed 3 lbs.; \$50,000 other than restricted stake at a mile or over or three races allowed 5 lbs.; two races, 7 lbs. (Maiden, claiming, starter and restricted allowance races not considered in allowances). A trophy will be presented to the winning owner. Closed Saturday, April 28, 2012 With 72 Nominations.

Footnotes

MARK VALESKI away without apparent mishap at the start, took up position in midpack from off the inside, rated kindly making his way towards the half mile pole, departed the backstretch three wide and crept up in the direction of the front runners, arrived at the quarter pole, four wide, and poised to strike, got set down after settling into upper stretch, closed the gap on the runner up, reached the eighth pole only a sliver behind, forged his way past a resilient rival and edged away, kept to a drive to the end. RIGHT TO VOTE assumed a forward position right from the start, went head to head for a short distance with THE LUMBER GUY before kicking clear just before going a quarter, set the splits, entrenched at a slight distance from off the rail and with another pair making their presence directly to the outside, felt increased pressure after going six furlongs, approached the quarter pole and was soon set down, appeared to be the first of the front runners to reach the furlong marker, albeit by at most inches, yielded to the relentless winner soon afterwards, but showed good determination to preserve the place. STREET LIFE lagged at the back of the pack for the opening three-quarters, was set down leaving the midway point on the turn, picked up speed noticeably nearing the end of the turn and spun five wide into the stretch losing none of his momentum in the process, displayed a good kick down the center of the track to take the show. GOOD MORNING DIVA placed five wide at the head of the stretch, finished

well belatedly en route to earning the last major check. BIG SCREEN brushed with MASTER RICK, with the rider pulling away from that opponent without success to avoid the light contact, raced as a forward factor for nearly three-quarters before backing away. THE LUMBER GUY raced as a team with the second place finisher as that pair made their way toward the end of the chute before being eased back to take up the role of stalker, was kept under a firm hold prompting the leader from the two path, got asked for a response in the vicinity of the quarter pole, remained prominently placed for a little while then tired. HAKAMA quickly tucked along the rail, faltered off the subsequent ground-saving journey. SUMMER FRONT got bumped after stumbling at the break, failed to reach a contending position. MASTER RICK bobbed prior to being bumped at the start, raced three to four wide around the turn and folded. LE BERNARDIN raced from off the inside, was put to some encouragement early down the backstretch, travelled in the three path under much stronger handling on the turn, had little left by the quarter pole and retreated to last.
