Footnotes

PERCUSSION established control soon after the start, rated kindly while showing the way from the inside on a loosely-contested lead during the initial stages, had the runner up draw directly abreast coming to the five-sixteenths pole, was to remain heads apart with the same opponent from that station all the way to the wire, got asked for some run angling three wide into the stretch, drifted out throughout the stretch drive while either desperately clinging to the barest of margins or on dead even terms with the second place finisher, brushed several times with FAST FALCON in deep stretch, gamely staved that foe off. FAST FALCON tracked the pacesetter while taking the inside route, squeezed his way into the two path midpoint on the turn, quickly ranged up to arrive at the five-sixteenths marker on nearly even terms with the winner, had a duel that lasted to the wire commence at that point, swung outside the winner into the stretch, had the rider pull hard on the right rein to put some space between himself and the errant top one both in upper and in midstretch, brushed at times with that foe in the final stages, fought hard to the end but got denied. BIRD RUN chased the winner from off the inside, fell back steadily despite getting asked for run on the turn. HEART BUTTE three wide departing the backstretch was much closer to the rail coming into the stretch, gave way. KINGS VILLAGE placed along the rail coming to the half mile pole, tired and got eased turning for home.
