SAGINAW cut the pace from just off the inside in hand, got challenged in earnest as PRIVATE TALE rolled up at the five-sixteenths, got let out nearing the quarter pole, dueled head to head widening away from the rest trading positions with each bob narrowly, drifted steadily never making contact with his main rival as they moved three paths out in tandem through the final sixteenth, dug in defiant to deny his main foe on the wire. PRIVATE TALE three to four wide within range of the front early on, came under light coaxing at the seven-sixteenths before having that encouragement intensify to take closer order at the three-eighths, bid for command at the five-sixteenths, hooked up in a spirited duel with SAGINAW, widened away from the remainder of the field through the stretch, dug in throughout fighting on to the wire while drifting in tandem with his main foe three paths or so through the final sixteenth but was ultimately denied on the line despite the game effort. METAURUS just off the pace just off the inside, got set down at the five-sixteenths, proved no match for the top pair while kicking on mildly for the show. HILLSWICK hustled at the start, chased two to three wide from just off the pace, faded from contention through the latter portion of the turn making no impact, then was vanned off after the finish.
