FOR THREE YEAR OLDS. No nomination fee. \$2,000 to pass the entry box. A supplemental nomination fee of \$2,500 in addition to the entry fee may be made at any time prior to the closing of entries. Starters to receive a \$1,500 rebate. The purse to be divided 60% to the owner of the winner, 20% to second, 10% to third, 5% to fourth, 3% to fifth and 2% divided equally among the remaining finishers. NYRA will waive the entry and starting fees, to the Belmont Stakes for the first three finishers of the Peter Pan excluding supplemental nominations. Weight 123 lbs. Non-winners of \$200,000 at a mile or over in 2011 allowed 3 lbs.; \$50,000 other than restricted stake at a mile or over or three races allowed 5 lbs.; two races, 7 lbs. (Maiden, claiming, starter and restricted allowance races not considered in allowances). A trophy will be presented to the winning owner. Closed Saturday, April 30, 2011 with 66 Nominations.

Footnotes

ALTERNATION sat reserved in midpack along the outside during the early stages, made steady progress initially in the two path and then three wide, until the seven-sixteenths pole, paused and was placed under a good hold, bidding time while racing amongst rivals, angled eagerly towards clearance a furlong down the road, turned for home, four wide and under urging, gained readily on the leader during the run through the furlong grounds, shadowed the errant leader outward a path or two during the final furlong en route to taking the lead at the wire to prevail by inches. ADIOS CHARLIE came way in good order and took up a forward position, was coaxed along in the three path, stalking the leader, advanced to make a challenge for command from midway on the turn, spun into the lane on even terms with BOLD DEED, had the lead only a couple of jumps later, emerged from the furlong grounds with a comfortable advantage, drifted out steadily from periodic left handed stick work, got collared right near the finish line and had to settle for being second best. PRIME CUT bobbed at the break, wrested away the pocket from a fellow rival in the vicinity of the seven-sixteenths pole, patiently tracked the pacesetter from there until upper stretch, angled to the outside before commencing to launch his rally, made a run until the furlong marker and flattened out. JOE VANN came

outward, making contact with MONZON at the break, took up a three wide pursuit, bid in earnest coming to the quarter pole, but soon backed away. BOLD DEED established control soon after the start, set the early splits from the middle of the backstretch, before settling into the two path, continued along well rated from there, got put to the test nearing the quarter pole, was set down and succumbed. MONZON was bumped at the start, sat near the back of the pack, angled five wide into the lane, but lacked the needed stretch response. BEER MEISTER saved ground throughout and was never a menace. NEWSADAD positioned six wide at the top of the lane, had no rally. UNCLE BRENT tracked the pacesetter from the inside under an early firm hold, was taken outward at the five-sixteenths pole, got called upon, but failed to fire. TAP ATTACK raced within range along the outside, was set down to a hard drive midpoint on the turn, advanced briefly, had nothing to offer by the quarter pole and faded.
