MARE AND CHER sat reserved during the early going, ranged up from the three path departing the backstretch to press the issue as the widest of a threesome for the next furlong, resumed the battle one on one with the runner up afterwards, newly positioned slightly closer to the rail, turned for home holding a slim advantage and was put to a drive, had the nemesis be the first to arrive at the eighth pole, but barely, fought on with determination to re-claim the lead, then edged away in the final seventy yards. CAJUN WEDDING out broke the field, was joined up shortly afterwards by a rank KUSHMEE KAT, had the eventual winner make it a three-way tussle from the end of the backstretch to the three-eighths pole, was asked for run prior to the quarter pole, won the fight through the furlong grounds to lead once more by a sliver of a margin, yielded it back then got shaken off in the last seventy yards. IT'S EASY brushed at the start, got tipped into the four path nearing the five-sixteenths marker, failed to close in appreciably on the front runners. GLENBROOK brushed at the break, was off a half beat behind the penultimate breaker as the field was sent on its way, quickly tucked along the rail and rode it to the five-sixteenths pole, lacked the needed stretch response. BALLERENA BLISS chased two to three wide and tired. KUSHMEE KAT lightly bumped from both sides, moved up to confront the early leader, vied outside that foe, displaying greenness by acting rankly, continued the pursuit from between opponents during the opening portion of the run around the turn, was guided over towards the inside coming to the five-sixteenths pole, gave way.
