COOL BLUE RED HOT lagged behind during the opening half, was given his cue and picked up interest nearing the end of the backstretch, motored into contention by quarter pole with a rail run, lost none of the momentum angling into the four path in upper stretch, gained ground rapidly with every stride, overhauled the pacesetter with about seventy yards remaining and edged away confidently. JOHANNESBURG SMILE sped off to an open lead down the backstretch, was guided into the two path nearing the half mile pole, continued cutting fractions around the bend, with the closest pursuers failing to apply pressure despite having been put to encouragement, was asked for run after entering the stretch, emerged from the furlong grounds with a sizeable advantage, but with the top one charging down the center of the strip fast, and yielded late. MOST HAPPY FELLA saved ground, was urged on the turn and proved no match for either of the top two finishers. THE BRUSH underwent a three wide pursuit, was put to a hard drive from midpoint on the turn but could make no headway on the leader. CHAIRMAN NOW off the inside, was through after completing three-quarters. CLEAR FAITH four wide, tired badly and was eased coming to the eighth pole, strolled across the finish line for the final check, was quickly dismounted and subsequently walked off the track under his own power.
