SUMMERTIME SAL lightly urged from the starting gate, was placed to a good hold after securing a forward position, raced within range towards the two path, between rivals on the turn, turned for home, still between and amongst rivals, was forced to squeeze into the three path heading for the stretch, and losing position to FRENCH TRANSITION at that station, responded positively once given his cue, gained readily between rivals down the lane, forged to the front in the vicinity of the sixteenth pole and showed good determination to fend off AFRICAN DIAMOND to preserve the decision. AFRICAN DIAMOND three wide around the turn, vied for the lead, the outermost of the embattled threesome, gained a short advantage striding toward the eighth pole, but with a host of rivals in contention and in hot pursuit, lost the lead a sixteenth down the road, battled hard to regain it, but had to settle for the place. SHOW TRIAL reserved along the outside, picked up the pace and was placed in the four path coming to the five-sixteenths pole, continued to swing outward, eventually winding up to be six wide at the top of the lane, and the widest of all, closed with good energy down the center of the strip to earn the show. FRENCH TRANSITION tucked to the rail nearing the end of the backstretch, crept up to the front runners from midpoint on the turn, took over the two path from the top one heading for the lane, was set down and commenced to rally, came home willingly to secure the final major check. J L BERNSTEIN kept pace three wide around the turn, swung five wide for the stretch drive and got outfinished. DANCE FLOOR MANIAC raced slightly off the inside, argued the pace with two others during the run around the bend, remained a prominent presence until midstretch and steadily weakened thereafter. CORVO was outrun. JIMMY VEGAS disputed the pace between rivals on the turn and stopped.
