Footnotes

A MCCOUGHTRY came out slightly, causing a minor crowding incident at the start, went on to assume the lead, took up residence in the two path, rated willingly while carving the pace, with another pair in close attendance throughout the opening three-quarters, got let out as the pressure increased coming to the quarter pole, had already begun to head towards the middle of the strip before being put to strong left handed stick work, resumed course towards the apron with much more intensity thereafter, yet held safely to the wire. JOYA REAL was put in tight quarters after being bumped by the top one leaving the starting gate, eventually having the rider take hold of the mount, sat reserved from the outside down the backstretch, advanced gradually into contention primarily in the two path during the run around the bend, was still two wide turning for home but ducked over to the recently vacated inside route, just past the quarter pole, displayed a mild rail rally, closing some ground on the badly drifting out winner en route for the place. GOLD EMPIRE got bumped at the start, saved ground for nearly six furlongs, angled outward just prior to the end of the turn, failed to cut into the leader's margin. CLOSING MOVE bumped at the start, was well outside proceeding to the half mile pole, made it into the three path by the beginning of the turn, failed to make her presence felt. GEISHA GAL at the tail end of the trouble at the start, made only light contact with the closest opponent, raced three wide around the turn, was under a full drive by the midway point, tired. SOUTH SHORE was the only member of the sextet entirely unscathed at the start, departed the backstretch from the four path, was put to a prolonged drive and folded. An objection lodged by the rider of JOYA REAL against the rider of A MCCOUGHTRY alleging interference at the start was not allowed.
