Footnotes

PRIVATE TALE leapt at the start, was off a beat slow as a result, crossed to the rail at the seven-eighths pole, saved ground in the turn until the three-eighths, shifted to the two path at that station, came under urging at the five-sixteenths to engage the front, confronted his speedy rival at the three-sixteenths under a drive, narrowed the gap through the lane, dug in to displace his main rival with yards to go to be up at the wire and prevail. STREET THUG sped off inside under an attended pace early on, remained on hold while marshalling the field around the turn, cut the corner into the lane while being spirited up, got confronted by the aforementioned rival at the three-sixteenths, dug in all out in response battling on until the final yards before yielding while well clear for the place honors. ADIRONDACK EXPRESS four wide through the turn at the rear of a tight group, was set down at the top of the lane, drifted out in deep stretch when shying from left handed stick work while rallying mildly for the show honors isolated both from the pair in front and those behind. THIS HARD LAND placed between rivals in the two path into the turn, came under a prolonged drive from the seven-sixteenths and offered little. TERM LOAN flashed brief speed vying for the lead early on, faded just prior to the half, came under light urging to keep pace, couldn't and was not persevered with in the lane.
