Footnotes

PARACHUTE CONEY broke in at the start bumping MAN IN BROWN SUIT before being taken off that rival, settled forwardly placed while four wide and unhurried until the three-eighths pole, commenced a bid under coaxing four wide through the turn making progress steadily on the front to loom at the head of the lane, was set down swinging three wide for home, kicked on with good energy having to a pause for a step or two as the leader drifted out just past the eighth pole, continued on with a good kick to just get up in the final stride and prevail. FREUD'S DEBUT tracked inside biding time in behind the front, availed of the opportunity to seize command just past the three-eighths when the leader stayed off the rail, was put to urging nearing the five-sixteenths pole, edged away to a comfortable margin with an eighth to go under a drive, shied out soon after from heavy left handed stick work, ran on with good effort but was caught on the line settling for place honors safely. CAT SWEEP settled towards the rear, progressed four to five wide on the far turn under a drive from the three-eighths pole, swung four wide in upper stretch, kicked into prominence with a furlong to go rallying on belatedly for the show while running out of ground to threaten the top. UNGUIDED MISSILE raced in midpack three wide until nearing the five-sixteenths pole, shifted to the rail at that juncture and was engaged by the rider, offered up a mild kick through the lane for the last major share. HAPPY HIGH saved ground towards the rear until nearing the five-sixteenths, shifted outside at that point while under urging, made steady progress swinging five wide in upper stretch, passed mostly tired rivals in the stretch. LOGICAL ORDER vied very early on briefly before setting the pace just off the inside from the two path, remained unhurried while still off the rail into the turn, had a rival slip up to take over inside just past the three-eighths, was put to urging in response remaining in contention until straightening for

home, steadily weakened thereafter. JAZZBO reserved at the rear, raced three wide most of the way, came under a drive midway on the far turn and offered no kick. BRASS NOTE bumped at the start when MAN IN BROWN SUIT was bounced off him after getting bumped himself by PARACHUTE CONEY, raced four to five wide appearing to try to get out down the backside and through the far turn while in midpack, proved no factor after coming under a drive midway on the turn and tired. MAN IN BROWN SUIT bumped at the start by PARACHUTE CONEY who broke inwards, vied early on before being pulled briefly back to concede the front, tracked three wide from that point, came under a drive at the midway point on the turn and steadily tired.
