ELTISH STAR tracked the front runners taking the inside route, was forced to sit on hold, trapped in traffic, with a wall of four spread out across the track lying just up ahead, and with another foe, in this case FRAMED, who was likewise stuck in traffic, preventing any attempt to angle outward for freedom, turned for home, still forced to sit under a snug hold and with no room to maneuver in sight, steadied in tight just off DORIAN WILL's heels in the vicinity of the three-sixteenths pole, found room to angle outward as the wall starting breaking up shortly afterwards, made his way to be outside of them all in two stages before reaching the eighth pole, got set down and began to close in, finished with good energy to get the head down right on the line. CREPE AU SUCRE placed under a good hold, contested the pace, the outermost of a threesome from the nine-sixteenths pole to the three-sixteenths pole, got called upon turning for home, practically in unison with the two others, worked his way to a short advantage, dug in with determination to preserve it, but got nailed at the wire. PERSON OF INTEREST reserved along the outside for nearly six furlongs, was placed in the four path at the five-sixteenths pole, entered the stretch from there and came home with good energy to earn the show. FRAMED raced between rivals until the five-sixteenths pole, left that station caught behind in traffic, was coaxed along to keep pace as best as possible during the ensuing furlong, finally swung out to be the widest of all leaving the three-sixteenths pole, was set down after completing the maneuver and rallied mildly en route for the last major share. FUGEDABOUDIT SANDY vied between rivals from the nine-sixteenths pole to the three-sixteenths pole and gave way. DORIAN WILL along the inside, contested the pace with another pair from nine-sixteenths pole to upper stretch, with all three front runners being rated along until the quarter pole, tired.
