DEBATING sat strongly rated behind the battling foursome up front while racing along the outside, was forced to continue to bide his time behind traffic entering the stretch, found a developing seam soon afterwards, deftly split rivals at the eighth pole then proved best under a drive. ALY'S WHEAT kept off the early pace activity, gradually advanced into contention after being asked for a response on the turn, ducked inward after clearing a fading rival midway on that bend, maintained his momentum and took charge in upper stretch, opened up a clear advantage with a furlong to go, dug in with determination when the top one made his challenge, wasn't up to the task, but continued on well to be well clear for the place. PRINCE OF IRON battled for the lead four wide until upper stretch, weakened during the final eighth. JAPENGO lacked a solid stretch response. ARCATA fought against the bit being rated between rivals during the run down the backstretch, continued to vie for the lead until the quarter pole and steadily tired thereafter. FRENCH TRANSITION battled between rivals for the lead and gave way after going a half. MR. UMPHREY stumbled a couple of jumps after the start, was the inside member of a four-way skirmish for the lead during the initial half before stopping.
