**Footnotes**

SILVERETTE cleared a tightly-bunched group at the start to grab the early lead, was taken over towards the inside and took up residence in the two path, cut the pace, pressed by another pair on turn, lightly hand urged to maintain interest, began to drift outward commencing the stretch run, with the rider futilely trying to counteract it by flashing the whip from the left side, had the pilot to commit to utilizing the stick left handed departing the furlong grounds, continued to drift outward but held off the runner up. SUPERIOR SARAH left the backstretch from the four path, was the widest of the front threesome around the turn, got asked for a response entering the stretch, voluntarily shadowed the winner outward throughout the stretch drive and had to settle for the place. VICTORIA LYNN out a step at the break, was pulled off ORIENT MOON before contact could be made, raced along the outside, swung three wide into upper stretch, drifted outward a couple of more paths during the initial portion of the stretch run, proved no match for the top twosome. ORIENT MOON forced the issue from between rivals on the turn, being asked for more run than either of the two other front runners, was set down by midpoint on the turn, kept up the pursuit until the quarter pole before backing away. STREET MATE faded off a ground-saving journey.
