CATRON was hustled away from the starting gate to assume a forward position, securing that spot with CELEBRATED TALENT tagging along one path to the outside and likewise being asked by its pilot for run, loosely drafted behind the pacesetter in the three path around the bend, began to close the gap approaching the quarter pole just as the pacesetter was swinging outward in an errant manner into the stretch, took charge during the run through the furlong grounds, extended the margin, being primarily hand urged. CHARLIE'S PICNIC three wide and under a drive midpoint on the turn, proved no match late. EASEMENT raced along the outside under some encouragement making his way on the bend, fanned about six wide into the stretch, rallied willingly to grab the show. PERFECT DANGER kicked clear in the early going, cut the pace three wide and under a drive midpoint on the turn, proved no match late. CELEBRATED TALENT underwent a four wide pursuit, gave way after entering the stretch. TO DARE IS TO DO quickly tucked along the rail and rode it nearly to the quarter pole, was fanned into the seven path, to be the widest of all, by the three-sixteenths pole, lacked the needed response to make more of an impact. RIDE A SONG saved ground and tired. POWDER SPRINGS chased the loose leader from the inside on the turn under encouragement, faltered.
