JOHANNESBURG SMILE away well from the gate, took up the front under light urging until safe before being placed under a light hold, showed the way inside through the turn coming under intensified pressure heading to the quarter pole, was let out at that station, edged away to increase his advantage, saw that margin cut into significantly in the final sixteenth, was kept busy to the end to repulse the challenge and prevail. SCHOOLYARD DREAMS broke in at the start and was off a beat slow as a result, was lightly urged to be forwardly placed before being taken back to track inside, came under a drive at the three-eighths to close in on the front, shifted to be four wide at the quarter pole, moved steadily into prominence with an eighth to go, cut into the winner's margin throughout the final furlong displaying a good kick which proved not to be enough for the win while safely clear for the place honors. ALMA D'ORO raced three wide in close pursuit, came under light hand urging at the five-sixteenths before being set down in earnest at the head of the lane, offered up a mild kick for the show. BEAU CHOIX crossed to the fence after the start, raced under reserve at the rear, came under light urging at the seven-sixteenths, shifted off the rail at the five-sixteenths to steadily cross out to swing five wide for home under a drive and offered no kick. COLIZEO broke sharply, was under light urging prompting the pace maker from the two path, got let out just past the five-sixteenths, remained prominent until the top of the stretch and weakened in the lane.
