AL'S LARK pressed the front runners three wide, ranged up to DIGGER KARAKORUM departing the backstretch, went by with confidence nearing the quarter pole, extended the lead once let out just past the three-sixteenths pole and safely maintained it, while drifting out in the late stages. AFRICAN KING off to a good beginning, was taken hold and eased back as things heated up early, was asked for some run by the half mile pole, took the overland route around the bend, closed well, but had to settle for being second best. DIGGER KARAKORUM vied between rivals to the half mile pole, tired steadily after being displaced. SCIBELLI sparred with two others for command during the initial stages, backed away shortly reaching the turn, was swung outward midway on the turn, temporarily taking away the four path from the runner up, went on to best the rest. THE CUFF SHOOTER four wide at the half mile pole, was no threat. ZOSOGOOD raced along the outside and through after going a half. ONE STARRY NITE offered little. UNDOCUMENTED never reached contention.
