**Footnotes**

COACH GRAVY away in good order, moved under his own power to take the early lead, showed the way from the two path on a loosely-contested lead with the rider applying rating tactics, was placed under stronger encouragement after turning for home, emerged from the furlong grounds with a comfortable advantage, began to noticeably shorten stride, appeared vulnerable at the sixteenth pole with a pair of foes in pursuit, but mustered up enough to preserve the decision. KILN CREEK rank during the opening stages pulling on the bit while resisting the rating pressure from the rider, responded more kindly nearing the turn, raced three wide around that bend, took off in earnest after the leader nearing the quarter pole, narrowed the gap leaving the eighth pole, took aim, but lacked the needed finishing touch. WELL MEANT was guided over to inside down the backstretch, rode the rail before angling outward in the vicinity of the three-sixteenths pole, gained mildly on the weakening leader, but had to settle for the show. FRENCH TRANSITION off the inside, improved his position by outkicking mainly weak ones during the stretch drive. MR. UNSTOPPABLE between rivals on the turn, lacked a solid stretch response. NATURAL SPEED chased the pacesetter from the outside for a half and backed off. MR. BOURBON STREET three wide, was asked for run on the turn but tired. FOUR STAR GENERAL off slowly, trailed throughout.
