Footnotes

MYSTICAL STAR forwardly placed from the start, advanced towards the early leader after entering the backstretch, took over without much need of encouragement and was tucked over to the rail once sufficiently clear, rated kindly while cutting the pace, continued along on the same scenario until late on the far turn, approached the quarter pole under light urging, was set down to stronger handling soon afterwards once the trailing quintet were themselves set down for the stretch drive, dug in with good determination to preserve the decision. ARUNA was put to a snug hold proceeding her way down the homestretch, saved ground until the half mile pole, tipped into two path departing that station, swung five wide under encouragement into the stretch, got straightened away and finished willingly to secure second. HIT IT RICH attended the pacesetter from the outside, issued a challenge coming to the quarter pole, got outfinished. PRINCIPAL ROLE bobbed at the start, was three wide on the opening bend but one path closer to the rail thereafter until the quarter pole, was asked for run spinning from the three path into the stretch, lacked the needed response. BANIMPIRE (IRE) strung out in the four path on the first turn, travelled three wide on the subsequent one, kept within striking distance for the opening mile, failed to fire appreciably when called upon at the quarter pole. THE UNDERLING came away in good order and strode to the front, kicked away from others in the early stages, got confronted soon after entering the backstretch and readily yielded the lead, contently tracked the new leader from the pocket, turned for home and had no offering to give.
