Footnotes

CHAYSEN' ALEX was unhurried while riding the rail, slipped off the inside at the five-sixteenths pole, came four wide into the stretch, took off in earnest after being straightened away, gained readily during the run through the furlong grounds, forged to the front near the sixteenth pole and edged clear. TARGHEE PASS in midpack during the opening stages, was put to strong encouragement while advancing into contention on the turn, held the lead for a few strides leaving the eighth pole, was caught by the top one a sixteenth later, but dug in stubbornly late to preserve the place. SOL A PINO kept off the pace, swung wide turning for home, settled into the five path at the head of the stretch, displayed a good late kick, just missing place honors. WHY NOT BE PERFECT was hustled away from the gate to grab the lead, cut the pace on an open lead, was overhauled just past the furlong marker and weakened steadily thereafter. CITIFEST took the inside route, had intentions of angling to the outside, but had to wait until the three-sixteenths pole, proceeded to be taken outward at that point, but lacked a solid response after being called upon. KEEPING THE HONOR four wide around the bend, was no factor. RICORIATOA underwent a mild three wide pursuit before backing off.
