Footnotes

FLAT OUT bobbed at the start after losing his footing at the break, sparred while under a hold with PERCUSSIONI down the chute and early along the backstretch, was allowed to ease back and stalk the previously-mentioned rival the rest of the way to the half mile pole, hitched up to the leader a second time approaching that station, crept up until on even terms a quarter down the road, took over under his own power, edged away and entered the stretch, was almost at the three-sixteenths pole before asked for run, gave it and remained comfortably in the clear. LAST GUNFIGHTER sat reserved from off the inside during the initial stages, departed the backstretch from the three path, got set down coming to the five-sixteenths pole, failed to dent into the winner's margin, lugged in momentarily and got taken in hand while locked up in combat with FAST FALCON with a sixteenth to go, got going properly again in short order and showed enough game ness to procure the place. FAST FALCON on the rail and under some urging to keep pace on the turn, was put to stronger encouragement taking the two path for entrance into the stretch, raced as a team with second place finisher for a good portion of the stretch drive and got outfinished for the place. ALPHA acted up prior to the first attempt to send the field on its way, thrashed about striking both sides of the stall with solid force and breaking opening the stall door, wasn't backed out, examined and reloaded, proceeded to break slightly to the outside, but was grabbed hold and safely kept from making contact with any of the others, gave chase from the two path and tired. PERCUSSION stumbled at the start, vied with the winner for much of the opening quarter and slightly beyond that until conceded an open advantage, was put to pressure by the top one heading for the end of the backstretch, kept up for the majority of the way on the turn, but requiring some urging to do so, before backing away.
