Footnotes

SUPER CHILD dueled along the inside into upper stretch and drifted out steadily through the final eighth prevailing under right hand urging late. IMANDRA rushed up along the rail after breaking slowly, waited briefly while threatening on the turn, angled between horses at the quarter pole, battled outside the winner while following that one out into deep stretch but could not get up. GYPSY CAMP pressed the winner three wide into upper stretch and weakened. CRAFTY GEM bobbed at the start, steadied in traffic at the half mile pole, raced in hand while in traffic on the turn, lodged a bid in midstretch and weakened. LOFTY raced within striking distance while four wide leaving the turn and lacked a late response. QUANTIFIER hesitated at the start and was never close thereafter. AMERICAN PRAYER stalked four wide for a half and gave way. PURSES AND SHOES raced well back along the rail, steadied in upper stretch and lacked a late response.
