Footnotes

HE'S SO FINE chased three wide, was put to encouragement at the five-sixteenths pole, grabbed a narrow advantage during the later stages of the run through the furlong grounds, and kicked clear. BRAZILIAN COURT broke in a step, lagged at or near the back of the pack while being outrun, was under a drive taking the four path for entrance into the lane, got straightened away and displayed a good kick to garner the place. MONEY IN RETURN angled outward at the quarter pole and flashed some late foot to take the show. GOT A HUNCH urged from the gate, failed to secure a forward position and was quickly taken over to the inside, got put to stronger handling midway on the turn, swung outward for the stretch run, failed to have any impact. MAJESTIC WIND along the inside in the early going, sparred for a few strides with HUGGY BOY before being put to a good hold and taken back, patiently tracked the previously mentioned opponent for a furlong commencing from the half mile pole, was maneuvered to the outside midway on the bend and was asked to pick it up, failed in the attempt to re bid for the lead and faltered. HUGGY BOY argued for control for several strides with MAJESTIC WIND before being conceded the front, cut the pace from a slight distance from off the rail, was asked for his best turning for home, yielded the top well before arriving at the furlong marker and retreated.
