SMUGGLER raced close up along the inside while in hand, angled out on the second turn, rallied three wide approaching the stretch, responded when roused and drew away late under a drive. SUMMERLY broke awkwardly but quickly showed in front, set the pace from the outside, could not stay with the winner in the final furlong and dug in stubbornly to hold the place. SPUN SUGAR pressed the pace from the inside and dug in stubbornly along the rail in the stretch. FOR ALL WE KNOW raced close up outside, chased the pace into the second turn and had no response when roused. ATLAS VALLEY was outrun early, raced wide on the second turn and had no rally. SEEKING THE ANTE bobbled at the start, dropped back early, raced wide and tired in the stretch. PLEASANT CHIMES was outrun early, raced inside and tired in the stretch.
