Footnotes

SAY TOBA SANDY broke near the top and sustained the good start to secure a good forward position, underwent a four wide pursuit around the turn, picked up the pace, still only lightly asked, nearing the quarter pole, swung as the widest of the front four into the stretch, fought intensely and only heads apart with STELLALUCE the entire length of the stretch, clung gamely to a narrow advantage to prove best. STELLALUCE chased three wide on the turn, ranged up to issue a challenge for command from between rivals coming to the quarter pole, got engaged in a long stretch duel with the top one soon after entering the stretch, battled hard racing head to head with that opponent, held on gamely to the bitter end, but had to settle for place honors. BOBITY BOO raced three wide around the bend, approached the quarter pole positioned just behind a wall of four rivals, was forced to swing five wide into the head of the stretch to gain optimal racing clearance, finished willingly to earn the show. SNEAKY GIRL unhurried in the two path on the turn, was put to strong hand encouragement after making it into the six path at the top of the lane, lacked the necessary response. TRIBECA made light contact with an errant RED HOT BABY at the start, but was pulled off that rival in time to prevent more serious damage at the break, was steadied shortly afterwards when the previously mentioned rival was settling near the rail, raced along the outside on the turn, weakened during the last eighth. CHAKA BWANA bobbed at the break, quickly overcame it and advanced to contest the pace, did so initially three wide then from the two path during the run around the bend, bid earnestly between rivals nearing the quarter pole, appeared to grab the slimmest of leads heading into the stretch, but with several others in close proximity bearing down hard, succumbed to them soon afterwards and tired. BOMBILLA saved ground until the quarter pole. RED HOT BABY broke awkwardly, coming inward just enough to bump lightly with TRIBECA, was gradually guided over towards the inside, tucking along the rail by the half mile pole, argued to maintain control all along the turn, came under heavier pressure leaving the five-sixteenths pole, and caved in to it.
