Footnotes

PLEASANT PRINCE well out in the middle of the track down the backstretch, sat perched just off the disputed pace, began to pick up interest departing the half mile pole, chased three wide around the bend, and spun from that path into the stretch under a hard drive, forged his way to the front during the ensuing furlong, then drew off, kept under a drive. RAIL TRIP advanced willingly under his own power towards the front after the break, argued for command with another pair until the half mile pole, was put to the test by COLIZEO leaving midpoint, with the revved up eventual winner lurking a serious threat three wide at a slight distance behind, gave in to that one's relentless pursuit just prior to reaching the furlong marker, held well to secure second. COLIZEO was the widest of a threesome vying for the lead down the backstretch, dropped closer to the rail once LITIGATION RISK fell back, issued a challenge in earnest coming to the five-sixteenths pole, but failed to sustain the move after turning for home. MODERN COWBOY unhurried during the early going, was placed four wide by the three-eighths pole, lacked the necessary stretch response while drifting outward in upper stretch. LITIGATION RISK disputed the pace between rivals until the half mile pole and stopped.
