MISSILE MOTOR patiently perched four wide off the speed duel being waged up ahead, was asked for run when ready at the five-sixteenths pole, drew alongside BELO SORTE in upper stretch, engaged in a spirited tussle with that rival, getting a nose in front at the wire to prevail. BELO SORTE urged from the gate to a forward position, dueled from the two path with ODE TO ROY, briefly shook free turning for home, got hooked up once more, this time by MISSILE MOTOR, went head to head with that rival from upper stretch to the finish line, only to come up on the short end of the win photo. WHO'S THE COWBOY was quickly guided over to the rail, took the inside route, was angled outward near the five-sixteenths pole, displayed a good kick down the middle of the strip, gaining rapidly on the battling pair in front to make things a bit interesting at the end. TALL POPPI outrun during the opening half, bested the rest. ODE TO ROY hustled early, disputed the pace from the three path for a half and faltered. THE ZIPSTER within range off the speed fight while racing along the outside, tired. FUJITA displayed brief foot.
