WELL KEPT broke running, grabbed early control and was guided over to the inside, showed the way being lightly coaxed along, was asked for much more by the five-sixteenths pole, reached upper stretch with the runner up now in hot pursuit, re established control during the ensuing sixteenth, increased the winning margin, crossing the finish line under a vigorous hand ride. LEAD ME ON was forced into the four path by an errant opponent nearing the end of the backstretch, strode professionally cruising up to the front runner from there using only her natural speed, got put to encouragement for the stretch run, was just off the leader's hind quarters, when forced to be taken hold, after lugging inward in the vicinity of the three-sixteenths pole, tried to do so a second time, once more forcing the rider to firmly take hold of the right rein to resume a straighter course, was easily second best finishing the last eighth under mild encouragement. BRILLIANT AUTUMN was given some attention with a rapid succession of choppy shots on the right shoulder departing the starting gate, was taken up after becoming extremely rank nearing the seven-sixteenths pole, lost ground and momentum with the pilot fighting to regain control, proceeded greenly around the turn, with the rider applying a strong hold on the reins, drifted out gradually but steadily, spun into the stretch from the five path, came home willingly enough thereafter to be up for the show. MERNA saved ground, angled out three wide into the lane, lacked the necessary response. CHESSRATE broke outward a step, chased the pacesetter from off the inside, folded. CHIPPEWA CHARLIE flicked off the rider after rearing up during the loading process, then got off a beat slowly at the break, left the backstretch three wide, pursued the leader until the quarter pole before backing away.
