JERSEY TOWN made light contact with TAPIZAR a couple of jumps after the start, tucked along the rail coming to the end of the backstretch, tracked the front runners sitting the pocket, being rated by the rider, availed of an opportunity to slip into the two path coming to the five-sixteenths pole, unleashed a challenge still positioned between rivals heading into the stretch, took over in the initial stages of the stretch run, emerged from the furlong grounds holding a comfortable advantage, drifting out noticeably in the last eighth, resisting right handed pressure from the rider attempting to counteract it. SHACKLEFORD broke alertly and quickly established control, cut the pace placed at a slight distance from off the rail, had the rider apply a firm to good hold until the vicinity of the five-sixteenths pole, was asked for some run and for still more when put to a stern test by the winner as the field arrived at the quarter pole, yielded after going a couple of additional strides, held off TRICKMEISTER to preserve the place. TRICKMEISTER stalked the pacesetter from off the inside nearly from the get-go, doing so after being put to early urging, kept up the pressure departing the backstretch, fell back and drifted out slightly after about halfway around the turn, was three wide at the five-sixteenths pole having lost position to the winner at this stage, turned for home having already put to a drive, proved no match for the top pair but held on well for the show. TO HONOR AND SERVE lightly bumped a short distance out of the starting gate, underwent a three wide pursuit, was asked for a response but failed to make his presence felt. GOLDDIGGER'S BOY rode the rail down the backstretch, but was in the two path in time for the run around the bend, was put to some encouragement shortly after entering it, swung four wide into the stretch, had no offering to render. TAPIZAR got bumped from between rivals just after the start, chased the front runners from off the inside, began to back away after leaving the half mil
