FOR TWO YEAR OLDS. No nomination fee. \$2,000 to pass the entry box. A supplemental nomination payment of \$4,000 in addition to the entry fee will be accepted at any time prior to entry. All starters including supplemental nominees will receive a \$1,000 rebate. The purse to be divided 60% to the owner of the winner, 20% to second, 10% to third, 5% to fourth, 3% to fifth and 2% divided equally among the remaining finishers. The owner of any two year old who has broken their maiden in a race at the Aqueductspring or Belmont spring/summer meetings is eligible for a one time bonus of \$100,000 which will count toward the horses earnings if that horse goes on to win a graded sweepstake at any NYRA track in 2012. 122 lbs. Non-winners of \$50,000 allowed 2 lbs.; aa race, 4 lbs.; maidens, 6 lbs. (Maiden, claiming and starter races not considered in allowances.) A trophy will be presented to the winning owner. Closed Saturday, September 15, 2012 with 30 Original Nominations and 1 Supplement.

Footnotes

OVERANALYZE was bumped from between rivals at the start, settled at the back of the pack, unasked for run, departed the backstretch from the two path, got asked to pick up the pace about halfway around the turn, felt the crack of the whip right handed a couple of jumps before spinning into the lane and then while doing so, eventually fanned to be five wide, the widest of all, got straightened away and took off in earnest after the front runners, picked up speed noticeably coming to the furlong marker, drew even with CARRIED INTEREST in the vicinity of the sixteenth pole, took over soon afterwards and kicked clear, finishing under a less than vigorous hand ride. CARRIED INTEREST disputed the pace from the two path, placed from between rivals, was at first one of three vying for the lead but had GULFPORT make it a foursome just past the half mile pole, turned for home on nearly even terms with HANDSOME JACK and got set down, forged his way to a narrow lead during the battle from upper to midstretch, had it taken away by the eventual winner with about a sixteenth remaining, but continued onward with good courage to secure second. WEEKEND HIDEAWAY appeared to take an awkward first step coming out of the starting gate, grabbed a forward position and pressed the issue from the three path, initially as the widest of three, and then from between rivals during the run around the bend, fell back slightly entering the stretch, but went on to hold his ground well thereafter en route for the show. HANDSOME JACK ducked inward, had the rider yank hard but was unable to pull off the nearest opponent and got bumped at the start, tucked along the inside shortly afterwards, was the innermost member of a four way fight for command on the turn, was head to head with the runner up entering the stretch, surrendered after dueling with that rival through the furlong grounds and backed away. GULFPORT out a step at the break, met an incoming SPECIAL JO and made contact with that rival, then got bounced around resulting from pressure coming from his outside almost immediately afterwards, had the rider readjust his foot in the left iron, was getting out despite a strong hold on the left rein nearing the end of the backstretch, was given enough rein and cruised up four wide to join the pace dispute, kept at it until the quarter pole and gave way. DRUM ROLL hard to load into the starting gate, proceeded to bobble at the break, chased the ongoing pace dispute two wide on the turn and tired. SPECIAL JO bumped at and just after the start, faded off a ground-saving journey.
