Footnotes

PALACE eased back slightly in the opening stages, departed the backstretch from the three path, disputed the pace from between rivals during the run around the bend, edged away approaching the quarter pole and was cued up being cross-reined leading the field into the stretch, lengthened away, got geared down in the final sixteenth while occasionally being flashed the whip right handed to maintain a true course in the final stages. RIVER RON tracked the ongoing pace fight while sitting a loose pocket, got asked for run in the vicinity of the five-sixteenths pole and began to pick up the pace, angled outward spinning into the stretch, was carried inward by MY COUSIN EDDIE nearing the eighth pole, eventually getting herded towards the rail enough to bump with FAIR TRADE, fell back steadily on the winner throughout the stretch drive, but got up for the place. WHO chased a four way battle for command from the two path, rallied with some willingness to miss out on place honors. LIGHT OF MERCY saved ground on the turn, was set down by midpoint, mustered up enough of a stretch response belatedly to grab the last major check. MY COUSIN EDDIE two wide on the turn, vied for lead from between rivals on the turn, was given two solid shots right handed and lugged inward in upper stretch, was on the receiving of another four solid shots, again right handed, shortly afterwards and lugged inward a second time, in this instance herding RIVER RON into making contact with FAIR TRADE, backed away. GEANTOR under a drive turning for home in the three path, lacked the needed response to have any real impact. SUNSHAWN got off a beat slowly, breaking a couple of steps

to the outside, was put to brisk hand urging and rushed up into a forward position, sat parked in the four path and pressed the issue as the widest of four until the end of the turn, tired. KEYALY loped along the rail down the backstretch and was outrun. FAIR TRADE settled along the inside soon after the start, took the inside route while arguing for command with three other rivals, in lanes two through four respectively, lost contact with the eventual winner during the initial portion of the stretch drive, was still a prominent for at least major award when put in tight quarters from pressure initiated by MY COUSIN EDDIE, went on to bump with the second place finisher and failed to regain any real interest thereafter. T C H WARRIOR three wide at the half mile pole, was never involved.
