Footnotes

WARRIOROFTHEROSES grabbed the advantage soon after the start, argued to maintain the lead, being rated along from the inside, had the runner up drew alongside late on the turn, was the first of the two front runners to have the pilot commit to a being asked for run, having done so entering the lane, dug in stubbornly throughout the stretch drive to prevail. BIG CITY BOY unhurried from off the inside for nearly a half, came four wide into upper stretch, showed good late foot to get up for the place. READTHEBYLINE prompted the pacesetter from the outside just about from the get-go, crept up to increase his presence leaving the midway point on the turn, spun into the stretch abreast of the top one, waited until the vicinity of the three-sixteenths pole before getting set down, was successfully rebuffed, then got outfinished in the final seventy yards for place honors as well. CHARLIE'S PUNCH three wide at the three-eighths pole, had no rally. DR. COPPER stalked the front running pair under a snug to good hold from the two path, was forced to bide time, awaiting suitable options behind that duo for a furlong, commencing from the five-sixteenths pole, failed to fire when finally called upon. GREELEY'S LAW got away awkwardly, making some contact with the left side of the starting gate, made up a good five plus lengths deficit to join up with the penultimate runner by the end of the backstretch, rode the rail until past the five-sixteenths pole, swung gradually three wide into upper stretch, lacked the needed response.
