INNER TURF FOR THREE-YEAR-OLDS AND UPWARD. No nomination fee. \$1,500 to pass the entry box. A supplemental nomination payment of \$3,000 in addition to the entry fee will be accepted any time prior to entry. All starters including supplemental nominees will receive a \$750 rebate. The purse to be divided 60% to the winner, 20% to second, 10% to third, 5% to fourth, 3% to fifth and 2% divided equally among the remaining finishers. Three year olds, 121 lbs. Older, 124 lbs. Turf weights: Non-winners of a graded sweepstake on the turf in 2012 allowed 3 lbs.; \$60,000 on the turf or a sweepstake on the turf in 2012, 5 lbs.; four races on the turf, 7 lbs. Dirt weights: Non-winners of a sweepstake on the dirt in 2012 allowed 2 lbs.; a sweepstake on the dirt; or \$45,000 on the dirt in 2012 4 lbs.; three races on the dirt, 6 lbs. (Maiden, claiming and starter races not considered). A trophy will be presented to the winning owner. The New York Racing Association reserves the right to transfer this race to the Main Track. In the event that this race is taken off the turf, dirt weights will apply and it may be subject to downgrading upon review by the Graded Stakes Committee. Closed Saturday, September 29, 2012 with 32 Nominations.

Footnotes

BOISTEROUS tucked along the rail well before reaching the end of the homestretch, contently took the inside route for just over three-quarters, slipped outward during the later stages of the run around the far turn, swung about five wide for the stretch drive, showed good acceleration after getting straightened away, approached the eighth pole charging down the outside of the course full of run and with only the slimmest of deficits to make it, did so in short order, edged away, completing the final furlong under a brisk hand ride and with only three widely-spaced right handed shots from the stick. SEE TOBE swung three wide leaving the opening bend, remained at the back of the pack, came four wide into upper stretch, went on a little further then was gradually taken wider still, displayed a good kick in the last eighth to get up for the place. TUNE ME IN patiently stalked the pacesetter from the outside, travelled three wide around the far turn and issued a challenge in earnest from there heading for the top of the stretch, battled with good energy during the ensuing furlong and beyond, from between rivals from midlane until the sixteenth pole, got outfinished late by the top pair, but held on well to the end for show honors. STORMY LORD quickly gained the early advantage, set the splits well rated from the two path until the quarter pole, came under heavy pressure in upper stretch and was let out in response, held on with good determination until the eighth pole, yielded a short distance past that station and steadily weakened. BOMBAGUIA tracked the leader being rated in the pocket, ignored clear passage for the taking until the quarter pole, unleashed a rail rally from upper to midstretch, flattened out. SKY BLAZER left the post parade and the pony as soon as he hit the track, proceeded to come away with any apparent mishap, sat reserved from of the inside, dragged the rider towards the front runners upon reaching the far turn from off the inside, stubbornly resisting the snug grip on the reins being applied on the reins by the pilot prior to the action, remained a prominent factor until deep into the furlong grounds and tired. BAROCCI (JPN) raced along the outside and was through after going six furlongs.
