ALBERT THE GREAT broke alertly, showed good speed along the rail, argued the pace, responded when roused and drew away under a steady drive. GANDER argued the pace from the outside, could not stay with the winner in the stretch but continued on well to earn the place prize. VISION AND VERSE was bumped at the start, raced close up inside while in hand, angled out and rallied three wide approaching the stretch and faded in the final furlong. AGOL LACK was bumped at the start and outrun early, advanced inside on the second turn, came four wide for the drive but could not sustain his run. LEMON DROP KID was bumped at the start and steadied from between rivals, dropped back in the early going, raced five wide on the second turn, ducked to the rail turning for home and had no rally. BEHRENS was rank in the gate, ducked in at the start, bumping LEMON DROP KID into VISION AND VERSE and AGOL LUCK, then was hustled outside, raced wide throughout, was forced to take up as LEMON DROP KID ducked over in front of him turning for home and tired in the stretch. SKIMMING chased the pace while three wide and tired in the stretch.
